We offer our mattresses in three styles: **Firm, Mid-Firm, and Plush**
Our mattresses come in all common sizes: **King, Queen, Full, and Twin**
(we offer custom sizes as well)

Our foundation boxes are well-built with 4" spacing between slats
and are available in all sizes at 7½" or 4½" thick.

For tight budgets, we also offer a one-sided 12" Economy Mattress (tufted)

Core: Our pocketed coil core is a patented butterfly-locking quad coil. It is the most versatile, durable, and sustainable support system in the world. The perimeter of the mattress forms a support edge that reduces or eliminates the roll-off feeling and delivers a consistent sleep surface.



Durability: We have always believed that using only top quality components will make the best mattress. In order to prove this, we submitted a mattress to be rigorously tested for durability. This test was performed by S.G.S. Govmark, located in Farmingdale, NY; the Rollator test #ASTM-F1566. A 175 lb. Rollator does 100,000 cycles over the mattress. This is equivalent to the amount of usage a mattress gets over an average ten-year sleep cycle. We are thrilled to say that our mattress was given a phenomenal rating. There was no body impression, no coil breakage, and no loose or damaged tufts! Overall height of the mattress only dropped ¼" of an inch; the foam density only dropped 1.6%.

Thank you for purchasing or considering a Stoltzfus Bedding product! It is a superior quality fashioned with your specific needs in mind.

The mattresses listed below are guaranteed against defects in material and workmanship (excluding the cover) when the rules for proper care are followed. This warranty will not apply to areas that are burned, soiled, stained, or if the mattress or box spring has been subjected to obvious abuse or improper care (see rules for proper care of your new mattress and foundation box below.) If any defect should appear, the defect will be repaired or the item will be replaced at the manufacturer's option. Transportation for the mattress will be at the purchaser's expense. If identical materials are not available at the time of warranty claim, the manufacturer reserves the right to substitute materials of comparable quality. The selling dealer is assigned by the manufacturer as his agent in handling any complaint. Any defects in the item should be reported to the selling dealer. Proof of purchase is required. The warranty is limited to the original purchaser, and will not apply to mattresses that are used with another company's foundation or box spring. This warranty is non-prorated and applies in full to the number of years as listed below. This warranty applies to mattresses manufactured after December 31, 2020.

- A uniformly firm wood foundation is absolutely necessary for long service life and lasting comfort of your new mattress. Do not use a sagging box spring.
- If your mattress is meant to be flipped, turn it over or end to end regularly (once a month for the first three months of use and every six months hereafter). This will help avoid body impressions cause by sleeping in one position continuously. However, be advised that all mattresses will show body impression as the filling materials settle. Body impressions that are less than 18% of the total mattress height are not considered a structural defect and are not covered by this warranty. The filling material is intended to provide cushioning and sleep comfort. A minor body impression is not an indication of any structural failure.
- King and queen-sized beds must have a center support leg in the bed frame.
- Do not remove the white cloth law labels on the end of the mattress. This serves as a means of identification for your warranty.

What is Hand Tufting?

Hand tufting is an age-old method by which mattress layers are held together. This process anchors these layers by driving a long needle and tufting straps all the way through the bed. Upholstery layers are pulled together through the spring unit, bound on each side, then finished with a decorative pom-pom or fleurette. Prior to this process taking place, the coil system and comfort layers are compressed. Once tufting is secured, the mattress layers remain taut and stable. Pre-compression limits body impressions and sagging. It also keeps materials from shifting or bunching over time.

Hand Tufting - Found Only on Luxury Mattresses

Hand tufting is a labor-intensive process that requires skilled craftsmen to complete. This type of workmanship is typically found in only high-end, expensive luxury bedding. Hand tufting has been used since the first coil spring mattresses were made. However, most major manufacturers have abandoned this technique in favor of the more cost-effective method of gluing layers together.

What are the Benefits of Hand Tufting?

- More uniform and consistent comfort feel
- Limited shifting or bunching of material
- Decreased body impressions and sagging over time
- Better overall support
- Extended durability and years to the life of your mattress.
- Less chemical usage in your mattress

Hand tufting also eliminates some of the excess bounce associated with latex mattresses. In summary, hand tufting adds comfort, support, and durability to your mattress. Take time to explore our full line of hand tufted beds.
